#### **Good News to Share**



When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us."

Luke 2:15

Shepherds in our nativity scenes are clean, well put-

together, and calm. In reality, they were probably scruffy, dirty, and beside themselves. Who wouldn't be excited after seeing a glowing company of angels singing in the night sky? They probably ran down into the village, eager to find this baby that they'd just heard so much about.

Isn't it interesting that God chose to announce the birth of the Savior to shepherds who were out in the hills? At the time, shepherds were thought to be untrustworthy people, on the fringe of decent society. And yet they were the ones entrusted with this overwhelming good news of God's love entering into the world.

It was just the right beginning to the life and ministry of Jesus, who would spend the majority of his time with people who lived on the edge—the poor, the sick, the 'unclean,' the less than perfect. Jesus' love and grace wasn't reserved for some, but was given to all, unconditionally.

This can bring us hope, knowing that God's love in Christ is not based on our worthiness, or our faith, or on what we have done. It also can nudge us to remember those who are in need in this season: the hungry, the homeless, the lonely, and those forgotten by others. We've been given this good news, and we are invited to share it in concrete ways during these seasons of Advent and Christmas (and in every season). Let's go with the eagerness of those shepherds!

## The Unparalleled Gravitas of God in Christmas



While the poignancy of candlelight and "Silent Night" is nearly inarguable, my love of Christmas goes way beyond nostalgia. The opening verses of the gospel of John in Christmas Day worship sum up the festival of the

Incarnation with unparalleled gravitas. Here's a sampling from the first 18 verses:

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him . . . And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory . . . full of grace and truth . . . grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son, who is close to the Father's heart, who has made him known.

In these verses, the eternal that occurs cosmically outside of time and the temporal that occurs historically in time come together as the creator bridges the gap that the creature cannot bridge. God fulfilling God's promise of presence in and for the world is more than we can fathom and all that is needed. As the season of Advent unfolds toward the festival of God's incarnation in Jesus on Christmas, I invite us to attend to our creaturely need for a savior both within and beyond our finitude. Add Christmas Day worship to your festival plans. Ponder anew where God's Word is taking on flesh in you, in our homes, in our church, and in our world.

## Traditional Christmas Eve broadcast—different radio station

#### Augustana Lutheran Church has a long history of

broadcasting the good news of the Gospel on Denver's airwaves. Virtually as long as Denver has had radio stations, Augustana has had a radio ministry of one type or another. Weekly broadcasts of services and sermons began in the 1950's and continued until 1998.

The broadcast of Augustana's Christmas Eve service has aired consecutively for over 50 years. In 2001, we began producing this one-hour program rather than running a live feed from the service. This was done to increase the audio quality of the program and to assure its reliability, as several programs had been interrupted in previous years due to technical difficulties related to the remote broadcast equipment.

#### From KOA to KHOW

This year only, the planned one-hour broadcast will happen over KOA's partner station KHOW-AM 630. This broadcast reaches most of the Western United States and will be heard at 11 p.m. on Christmas Eve, Monday, December 24.

Each year Augustana receives dozens of reports, acknowledgements, and thank-you notes from members and strangers who hear the broadcast at home and in the car throughout the country.


While all students will gather for some large group worship time, separate tracks for middle and high school students will allow each group to participate in ageappropriate conversation and activity-based learning.

## Consider toy safety while gift shopping



With the Christmas season approaching, now is a great time to think about toy safety, before you make any purchases. Toys are meant to be fun, yet every year there are 251,700 toy related emergency room visits in the United States, with 1/3 of these injuries to kids 4 and under.

#### Tips to keep in mind when selecting a toy:

- Follow the recommended age listed on the toy
- Look for labels that the toy has passed a safety inspection, i.e. ASTM, an international safety standard
- Balloons can choke or suffocate. Keep deflated balloons away from kids younger than eight years old. Discard broken balloons immediately.
- Small balls/magnets/button batteries/toys with small parts should not be given to kids three and under due to the danger of choking. If an item or part can fit inside a toilet paper cardboard tube, it is too small for them.
- Buy toys made of substances that can be regularly cleaned.
- Check the eyes of stuffed toys, if they can be pulled out, do not buy if small kids will be around this toy.
- Avoid high-powered magnet sets such as Buckyballs for kids under age 14. If swallowed, magnets can cause injury, and may require surgical removal.
- Include the right size helmet and safety gear along with gifts of bikes, skates, skateboards, etc.

- Inspect toys before purchase; avoid toys with sharp edges/points or parts that fly off.
- Buy battery operated toys for kids under 10, avoiding toys that must be plugged into an outlet.
- Check out the EasterSealTech.com article on Top 10
  Tips for Buying Toys for Kids with Special Needs.
  Choose toys that may appeal to different senses such as sound, movement, and texture; consider interactive toys to allow the child to play with others; and think about the size of the toy and the position a child would need to be in to play with it.
- Only give crayons and markers labeled "nontoxic."
- Hoverboards (not considered a toy) should be compliant with UL 2272 safety standard.


