John 14:1-7


The holy gospel according to John. Glory to you, O Lord.

Delores "Dee" Bailey Vellinga

June 20, 1949-August 26, 2022

Delores "Dee" Ann Bailey was born on June 20, 1949 in Haywarden, Iowa. She lived in Elk Point, South Dakota until the age of 12 when the family moved to Warren Place in Sioux Falls. She attended Patrick Henry Junior High and then Washington High until Lincoln High was built. She graduated in 1967 from Lincoln High. Before graduating, Dee, with the support of many family members, began working at the telephone company (starting in 1965). While working, and after graduating high school, Dee attended multiple colleges including Augustana College. During that time, she met, married, and later divorced Mark Vellinga. The two had a son, Adam. Dee's mother, Irene, became sick with cancer and passed away during this time. Her father, Don, later married Rose. Dee decided to leave Sioux Falls and accepted a position with the telephone company in Omaha, Nebraska. Her career took off there. She started saying "I'm just a girl from South Dakota and look at

where we are now." Two years after moving to Omaha, Dee and Adam moved again to Denver, Colorado. Three years after that move, Dee was diagnosed with breast cancer. She didn't know failure was an option and survived the worst of the worst during her treatment. She retired from USWest in 1997. In 1999 she accomplished a life-long dream when she graduated from college (Regis University). She decided to go back to work after that, first as a travel agent and then later as a leader in legal records. Throughout her life, she battled various types of cancers and experienced many complications from the diseases and treatments. Even when battling, Dee loved to love life. Along the way Dee travelled as much as possible, including highlights from her timeshare in Puerto Vallarta, trips to Europe with family, and various trips with lots of friends and family. Dee retired again in 2020. After retirement, she spent as much time as possible with family and friends.
