Lord's Prayer


Our Father, who art in heaven,

The Matriarch of Montclair Jane Marie Carlstrom (nee Olson). Born August 6, 1927 in Hudson, Wisconsin.

Jane was preceded in death by her beloved husband of 67 years, Donald "Cully" Carlstrom. Her partner in crime, travel buddy, and gentleman scholar. She is survived by her children Mary Rutherford-Birkey (Dave), Martin (Jamie), and Matthew (Ida). Grandchildren Taylor, Max, Avery, Cullen, and Chloe.
