Hello, everyone,

Please note that we plan to hold our 2023 annual congregation meeting on Sunday, January 15 at 11:45 a.m., following 10:30 a.m. worship. Your attendance is greatly appreciated for this important event to vote on our 2023 budget and elect new members to Council (adult and youth), Synod Assembly, and our Nominating Committee for 2023. We expect there will be other items to discuss and approve, including ratification of the constitutional change in quorum requirement from 75 down to 60.

As you may recall, at our special congregation meeting this past August 28, we unanimously approved to have one minimum congregation meeting per year, and decided on January as the appropriate month in order to provide more time for budget planning. And we may still have special congregation meetings as needed.

As I write this note to you, I'm in the thick of recovering from shoulder capsule surgery in mid-November. Physical Therapy rules my schedule to recover as much range of motion

as possible while the tendinitis pain recedes that built up over summer and fall. I'm breathing and counting multiple times a day. Breathe in, stretch, hold stretch while slowly breathing out, 2...3...4...5... Ten repetitions of each stretch, twice through the series, makes for a lot of breathing. 

Music Ministry

Memorial gift provides new stop for sanctuary organ

When Augustana Lutheran Church was downtown, the church's last pipe organ was built in the 1930's by the Reuter Organ Company of Kansas. When the congregation relocated to its current location in the late 1950's, the organ was moved into the present Sanctuary behind the grill cloth in the chancel (front). The organ was underpowered for such a large worship space. In the mid-1980's further work was done to the organ; several stops were added including the loud trumpet in the rear gallery and the large visible copper pipes in the chancel. One stop intended for this project but not added due to funding was the tuba. A tuba is a powerful solo stop which is especially useful in hymn playing when wanting to bring out a melody line. This past summer John Flory stepped forward after deciding that he wanted to add the missing tuba to the organ in memory of his wife, Alma. The stop is built by the same Reuter Organ Company. Reuter installed the stop on December 1.

We plan to dedicate this stop in 10:30 a.m. worship on January 29. More information will follow, but I am excited about this addition to the organ which will be a great resource in hymns, service music, and organ repertoire. We thank John and family for this gift which will enrich worship at Augustana.

Care of Creation Highlights from the Advent discussion, *Sleepers Wake*

Creation Care is part of CAN Ministry's leadership efforts on behalf of the congregation as well as our local and global partnerships including Together Colorado.

Augustana's Advent study of *Sleeper's Awake* by Nicholas Holtam, former lead bishop for the environment for the Church of England, offered much inspiring information about one of our sister churches. Several points are shared below:

- Following the (Church of England's) General Synod in 2014, all bishops made the care of God's creation one of their priorities. (page 3)
- The National Investing Bodies (NIBs) of the Church of England are committed to achieving net-zero emissions portfolios by 2050 at the latest and making substantial progress to achieve net zero earlier. (page 96)
- In response to the General Synod's aim for the Church of England to become net zero by 2030, we have to focus on our buildings. Religious faith is a powerful resource for this transition. (page 98)

Help make or supply Personal Care Kits for Undie Sunday

Undie Sunday/Personal Care Kits, January 29-February 19

What is a Personal Care Kit (PCK)?

Five items for personal care: towel, bar of soap, comb, toothbrush, nail clipper. See details at <u>https://lwr.org/kits/personal-care-kits/instructions</u>.

Who receives the PCK?

Lutheran World Relief (associated with ELCA World Hunger) distributes them to refugees who have fled their homes for safety or to families whose homes are destroyed by disasters. They flee with minimal items in their backpacks. In 2020, 72,000 PCKs were sent to people in 23 countries.

Why?

After fleeing their homes, they arrive in refugee camps scared, vulnerable, and dirty from travel. A PCK gives them a chance to restore their dignity by having these simple items for self care. PCKs remind them that they are not alone, as the gifts show God's love in a personal way.

What next?

During Undie Sunday in February, Augustana members and friends can assemble PCKs or donate any of the five items. There are boxes in Fellowship Hall and the narthex to put single items for PCK assembly. Assembled kits can be placed at the communion altars. Assembling PCKs is a great opportunity for friends and families with young children to become aware of the needs of others in the world and to share love by simply making a PCK.

Tips for buying and assembling PCKs:

- Carefully follow the assembly guidelines!
- If you purchase multi-pack toothbrushes, put the individual toothbrush in an envelope.
- Buy lightweight towels in dark colors so they can dry quickly in the camps.
- Do not add any other items or use any plastic bags.
- If you prefer, you can support the shipping, which is \$2.65 per item.
- Assemble four items in the folded towel and secure with yarn, ribbon, or rubber bands.
