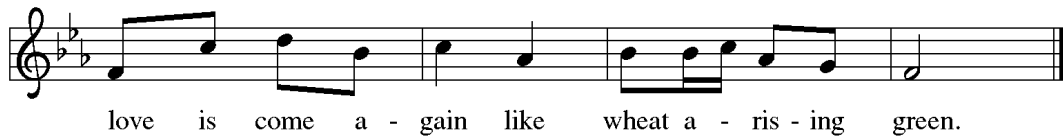

Holy Communion

- *We trust that the love of Christ is truly present in the bread and wine of holy communion. All adults, and children of any age with parental permission, are welcome to commune—both those present in person and on livestream.*
- *The ushers will invite you into the center aisle to receive a wafer of bread from the server. Hold your wafer and move to the next server. Dip your wafer in either the wine (darker color) or grape juice (lighter color). This is called intinction.*
- *Please let the server know if you need a gluten-free wafer. We will offer you the container so that you may touch it yourself. The wafer is full communion on its own if you'd rather not dip it into the wine and grape juice that have touched other wafers.*
- *If you desire a blessing rather than communion, please approach the servers with your arms crossed.*
- *If you are unable to come forward for communion, please inform an usher so that communion may be brought to you in the pew.*

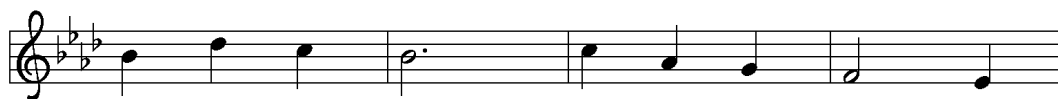

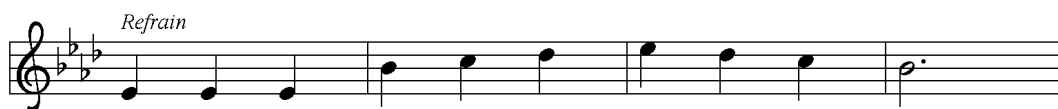
