Psalm 4:1

# Being the Church in Physical Distance

over 1,100 of us were together on a Sunday morning we would spill out down the halls and into the street —and that doesn't even count our ongoing visitors and newcomers. Pray for them too! Visualizing our reality in this time of physical distancing for coronavirus is vital. We remain the church, still able to reassure each other and the world that God's love is for us no matter what we do or don't do. We remain valuable and beloved children of God regardless of our risk category for surviving a corona infection. The reactions and rhetoric during these times can make it harder to even remember God's promises much less be reassured by them. Jesus speaks into our worry and fear:

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid.

John 14:27

Jesus reassures us in scripture and also through each other as the body of Christ in the world. This means that our connections with each other are Holy-Spirit-infused even if they take place virtually or over the phone. So, in addition to praying for each other, please reach out to each other by phone, email, or Facebook messaging. Our eldest elders in the congregation can be challenged by social isolation in the best of times. Imagine how difficult physical distancing is for those of us labeled "high risk and vulnerable." Be creative. Be gentle and generous. Be of good courage. Be the church, dear ones —for each other and for the world God so loves.

I love this hymn and remember my Father playing it on the piano and singing in his baritone voice. Hearing this hymn conjures up images of Thanksgiving feasts and happy blessed days. Besides a striking tune, what is most impressive is the history of when this hymn was written by German protestant Pastor Martin Rinkart in Eilenburg, Germany. Written in 1636 while The Thirty Years' War was raging, this pastor was conducting as many as 50 funerals a day. A severe plague and famine was taking many lives in the overcrowded walled city of Eilenburg.

Thankfulness amidst such conditions? Seriously?

Our faith may be challenged during these uncertain days of witnessing a pandemic spread across continents. Be sure to refer to our Augustana website for the latest updates on how Augustana is seeking to minimize exposure to COVID-19. And follow CDC guidelines.
