We are in the liturgical season of Lent, which spans 40 days from Ash Wednesday to Easter, not including Sundays, on which we always celebrate the resurrection. The disciplines of Lent include repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving, and works of love. Worship sustains these disciplines by faith. Freed by God's promise of grace through the cross of Jesus, we can tell the truth about our fragile imperfection and where we fall short in loving God, self, and neighbor. We join our voices with the psalmist as we repent and pray throughout Lent, "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me."

Blessed be the holy Trinity, \blacksquare one God, the keeper of the covenant, the source of steadfast love, our rock and our redeemer. **Amen.**


God hears us when we cry, and draws us close in Jesus Christ. Let us return to the one who is full of compassion.





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

We give you thanks . . . in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. **Amen.**


The candidate is baptized.


Great Thanksgiving

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.


It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks and praise . . . we praise your name and join their unending hymn:
