The disciplines of Lent include repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving, and works of love. Worship sustains these disciplines by faith. Freed by God's promise of grace through the cross of Jesus, we can tell the truth about our fragile imperfection and where we fall short in loving God, self, and neighbor. We join our voices with the psalmist as we repent and pray throughout Lent, "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me." (Psalm 51:10)

Others said, "An angel has spoken to him." ³⁰Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. ³¹Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. ³²And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." ³³He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.



We give you thanks . . . in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.


The candidate is baptized.


Great Thanksgiving


