Water may be poured into the font as the presiding minister gives thanks.





Acts 1:1–11

A reading from Acts.

[Luke writes:] ¹In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning ²until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. ³After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. ⁴While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; ⁵for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."


⁶So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" ⁷He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." ⁹When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. ¹¹They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? 
Second Reading

Ephesians 1:15–23

A reading from Ephesians.

¹⁵I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason ¹⁶I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers. ¹⁷I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you come to know him, ¹⁸so that, with the eyes of your heart enlightened, you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance among the saints, ¹⁹ and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. ²⁰God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, ²¹far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the age to come. ²²And he has put all things under his feet and has made him the head over all things for the church, ²³which is his body, the fullness of him who fills all in all.

Luke 24:44–53

The holy gospel according to Luke. Glory to you, O Lord. ⁴⁴[Jesus said to the eleven and those with them,] "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." ⁴⁵Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, ⁴⁶and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷ and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. ⁴⁸You are witnesses of these things. ⁴⁹And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high." ⁵⁰Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them. ⁵¹While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. ⁵²And they worshiped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; ⁵³and they were continually in the temple blessing God. 
Lord's Prayer

Ordination Anniversaries

We give thanks to God today for our brothers and sister, leaders and servants in the Body of Christ.

Pastor Ron Swenson, celebrating 60 years of ordination: He was ordained in Seattle in June 1960 as part of the Augustana Synod annual meeting. He served in rural and suburban churches in Minnesota, then in Switzerland at Geneva Lutheran, back to Salem Lutheran Church in St. Cloud, MN, and finally at Augustana in Denver 1980–1998.

Pastor John Pederson, celebrating 45 years of ordination: He was ordained at Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Minneapolis in October 1975. He served in White Bear Lake, MN, then Trinity Lutheran Church in Ft. Collins 1978–1998, then at Augustana in Denver 1998–2014. John studied philosophy at Harvard and theology at Andover Newton prior to receiving his Masters of Theology at Luther Seminary.

Pastor Bonita Bock, celebrating 40 years of ordination: She served a number of years as a parish pastor after

receiving her Masters of Divinity from Luther Seminary, was the Director of The Urban Servant Corps in Denver, then the Co-Director of Wartburg West in Denver and a faculty member of the Religion Department of Wartburg College. She was also an adjunct professor at Iliff School of Theology in Denver.

Pastor Ron Glusenkamp, celebrating 40 years of ordination: Ron received his Master of Divinity from Christ Seminary-Seminex. He served congregations in Wichita, Kansas City, and St. Louis. He was Senior Pastor at Bethany Lutheran Church in Cherry Hills Village 2006–2014, and he was the director of the ELCA's Always Being Made New campaign 2014–2020. That campaign raised \$250 million dollars in gifts for a wide variety of ministries that are part of the ELCA.
