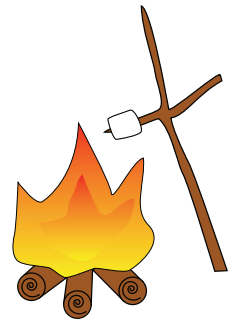


S'more Fun & Worship returns this month!

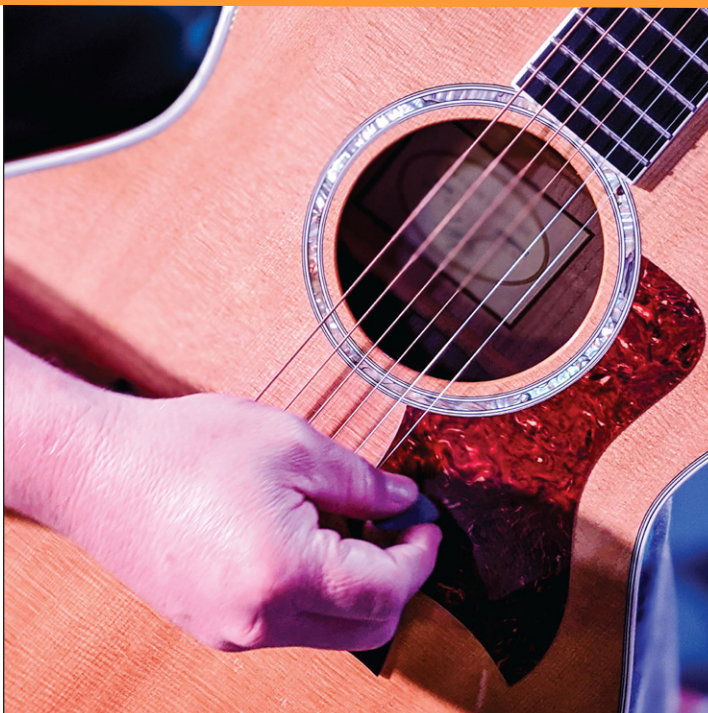


All are invited

I couldn't agree more with Pastor Caitlin's reflections in her column regarding in-person worship. It was wonderful in May to gather under the courtyard tent again, and it is also moving and so inspirational to gather in the sanctuary again! Thank you to

our Reopening Task Force, staff, congregation council and all the volunteers that have made this movement forward possible.

As we begin to live into a sense of things returning to normal, as a congregation we can focus on those ministries that needed to be paused while we responded to the pandemic. Our mission statement guides our life together at Augustana as we move forward: *Celebrating God's grace, we welcome everyone to worship Jesus, grow in faith, and go serve in the world.*

We are living out and into that statement in these next months as we interview and hire a new director for the Chancel Choir. Faith formation for all ages will move to in-person opportunities in the fall. And serving the world and the community will continue, hopefully with a boisterous and productive rice and beans break down on "God's work. Our hands." Sunday, September 12.

One of the other areas of focus will be our welcome of others to Augustana. Early in 2020 Pastor Caitlin and the new Welcome Committee met with a consultant from the ELCA to talk about how our narthex area could be configured to be more inviting and functional. Inspired by the improvements another mid-century modern ELCA congregation made to their narthex, this group and the congregation council will now be able to pursue these possibilities.

You may be aware of a recent study in the United States which discovered that those answering "none," in regard to their faith affiliation are now equal in number to Roman Catholics and Protestants. This presents a challenge and also an opportunity to congregations like Augustana. How can we listen to those who are the "nones" in our communities? How can we make the

faith we share welcoming, accessible, and a graceful experience of Christ's love?

Our excitement at being able to worship in the sanctuary, care for others and serve needs to be shared with others. Jesus invites us to share this journey together!

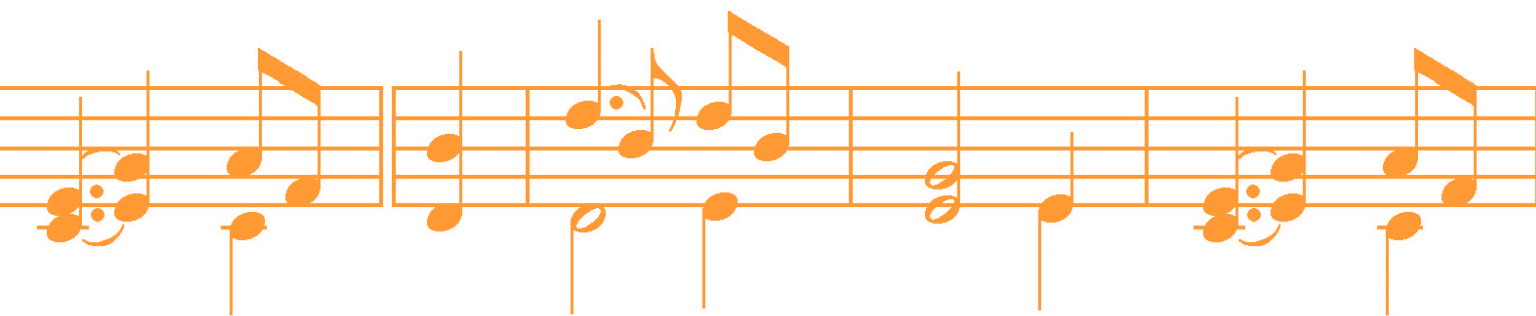

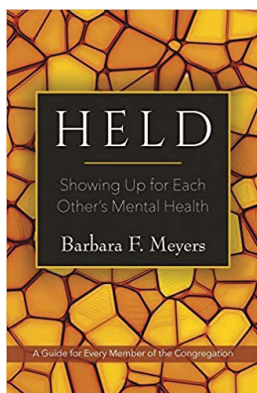


E4 Monthly Gatherings to start in June

Dakota Avenue Project Update

The project to construct affordable townhomes on the land Augustana owns is continuing to move forward. In May, members of Augustana, Habitat for Humanity, and our Denver City Councilwoman, Amanda Sawyer, met via Zoom with all the neighbors who are part of the Preservation of South Hilltop Neighborhood Association.

Habitat explained the scope of the townhome project and again emphasized the working families that they partner with to provide housing. Augustana representatives reiterated our commitment to outreach in the community and to being a good neighbor. There was also a time for questions from the neighborhood.

The next step is a rezoning of the property through the City and County of Denver, which Habitat will be leading. Although the process is lengthy, the final project will be a great partnership between Augustana, Habitat, and families who deserve decent affordable housing.

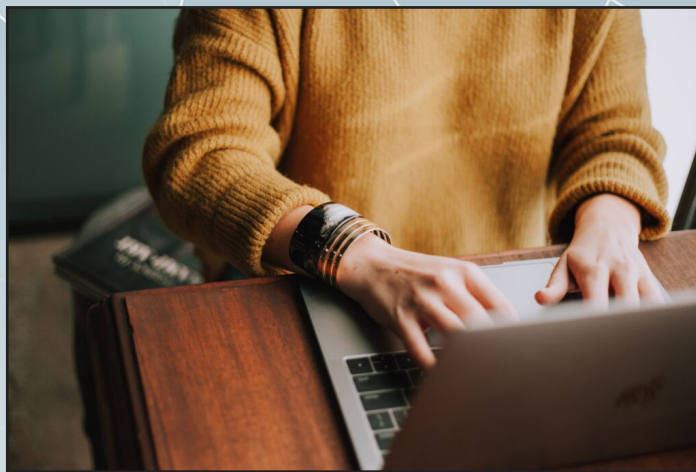

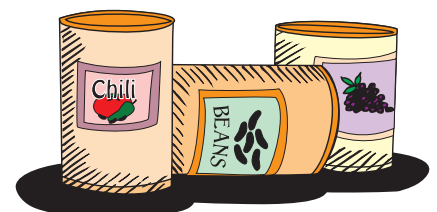

Providing hope by solving and preventing vehicle crisis issues for working single moms.

Hands of The Carpenter (Hands) has been operating to address obstacles preventing working single mothers with dependent children from being financially secure. Unreliable transportation was identified as an issue that no one was addressing consistently. To meet this need, Hands provides vehicle repairs and on-going maintenance, prepares donated cars for placement with women who don't have safe and reliable vehicles, and teaches clients how to properly care for their cars.

You can help a single mom by donating a vehicle. Hands accepts and utilizes car donations to support women striving to maintain employment, care for their families, and achieve self-sufficiency. Any car (running or not) will be accepted although ones 5–10 years-old are most preferred. Building economic stability and independence for women

In Washington, D.C., the Beloved Community Incubator is based on the idea of investing in people and in the Logan Circle neighborhood. The project began with a listening campaign in which residents of the community expressed their desire for cooperatives that would allow them to use their skills and talents to build wealth and income that would stay in the community.

The first cooperative incubated by Luther Place was Dulce Hogar, a cooperative of women who provide cleaning services for homes and businesses. Together, the women learned how to run a business, how to pursue just employment, and how to develop their own skills as leaders. As one participant describes it: "The vision of the cooperative is that all eight of us are well-paid and well-trained, and that we get to invest money in our families and in our community."

The members of the cooperative were even paid for the time they spent in meetings and trainings. They learned together that their time and labor had value that far exceeded the wages they had been offered before. And now, with an investment in them, they will be able to invest in others.

Projects such as the Beloved Community Incubator offer a counter-witness to the policies and practices of disinvestment that have created communities with high rates of poverty and food insecurity across the United States. These policies and practices are rooted in the misperception that some communities are worth investing in and others are not. But the residents of Logan Circle know that, despite the challenges they face, their community is worth the investment, and a better future is worth pursuing. Reclusive literary legend M. M. "Mimi" Banning has been holed up in her Bel Air mansion for years. But after falling prey to a Bernie Madoff-style ponzi scheme, she's flat broke. Now Mimi must write a new book for the first time in decades, and to ensure the timely delivery of her manuscript, her New York publisher sends an assistant to monitor her progress. The prickly Mimi reluctantly complies—with a few stipulations: No Ivy-Leaguers or English majors. Must drive, cook, tidy. Computer whiz. Good with kids. Quiet, discreet, sane.



When Alice Whitley arrives at the Banning mansion, she's put to work right away—as a full-time companion to Frank, the writer's eccentric nine-year-old, a boy with the wit of Noel Coward, the wardrobe of a 1930s movie star, and very little in common with his fellow fourth-graders.

As she slowly gets to know Frank, Alice becomes consumed with finding out who Frank's father is, how his gorgeous "piano teacher and itinerant male role model" Xander fits into the Banning family equation—and whether Mimi will ever finish that book.
