


Augustana Foundation - Flow of Funds



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Money Comes in:

- Bequests
- Memorials
- Lifetime giving

Funds are invested:

- Interest from bonds
- Dividends from stocks
- Gains and losses

Grants are made:

- Augustana ministries
- Scholarships
- Outside organizations

Grants Made - Overview

- Each year, the Foundation gives away its earnings on invested assets
 - ✤ Dividends
 - ✤ Interest
 - Realized gains or losses on disposal of assets
 - Unrealized gains on stocks
- Calculation and other information
 - Currently, we are using a 3-year average to avoid fluctuation
 - Previously, we were using 4% of invested assets
 - No requirement to give it all away every year; however, in recent years, we have – current surplus is ~\$200,000
- Further adjust for Julia Swanson perpetual annuity

- Absent the 3-year averaging, we would be giving away \$251,600 in 2021 v \$150,000 in 2020
- Using 3-year averaging, we are giving away \$180,000 in 2021 v \$145,000 in 2020
- The reduction in volatility helps both the grant recipients and the Foundation

- For the last several years the Foundation has given \$40,000 \$50,000 per year to the Capital Improvement fund – supplements other donations to the fund and helps to avoid "capital campaigns"
- Over time, Augustana has budgeted for certain expenses that were previously paid by the Foundation



The Scholarship Program

- Since 1986, the Foundation has provided \$252,300 to Augustana members who have chosen to attend Lutheran colleges and/or seminaries
 - Program was established in 1983 as the Higher Education Fund
 - Initial funding came from the John Guenther Scholarship Fund
- Records prior to 1996 are incomplete; since then, we have supported 24 individuals with more than \$145,000 in scholarships
- Program structure
 - \$2,000 per academic year for undergraduates/\$4,000 per academic year for seminarians
 - Application must be re-submitted each year
 - Award amounts have not been adjusted since at least 2000
- We are revising the Program
 - Considering adjustments to the annual scholarship amount
 - Simplifying and streamlining the application process



Grants to Community Organizations - 1986 - 2020

- We have made grants to 159 entities in this 34-year period
 - ✤ ~5 outside agencies per year
 - 132 entities have received <3 grants; 84 have received only 1
- Aligned with Augustana's outreach efforts
- Evaluating different approaches
 - Partnerships
 - Simplification
- Balance internal needs with strategic priorities

Grant Review Process

- All submissions reviewed quarterly (Feb, May, Aug, Nov) must be received by last Friday of the month prior
- Application on Website process moving toward fully electronic
- Grants not actively solicited while invitations to apply are made each quarter through the Tower, ePistle and the Bulletin, we don't reach out to targeted organizations
- Some recurrent grants awarded in Feb to be distributed over year
 - e.g., ALC Capital Improvement Fund, Lutheran Family Services
- Budget based on annual grant calculation (see slide 5)
- Gifts/Grants Committee reviews applications in detail and provides recommendations to the full Foundation Board for the quarterly meeting



Considerations when reviewing grants

- How does the proposal support Augustana's Mission (Worship-Grow-Go)?
- Is the organization Lutheran-based? Christian-based?
- Is the person submitting the application affiliated with Augustana Lutheran Church?
- Is the money requested for a specific project or for general operating funds?
- What additional funding sources are there for the project?
- What percentage of the organization's budget would the gift provide (how impactful would the grant be)?
- How many people will the grant benefit or impact?
- Is the organization new or established? Have we funded it before? How recently?
- Is the organization reputable or vouched for by another reputable/trusted organization? (especially important for international requests)
- Is the proposal being supported through other Augustana funds? (benevolence, etc.)
- Is the grant meeting a critical/urgent need for the church or community?
- Attempt to balance internal and external awards

Augustana Arts

I'm excited to share with you that City Drums, our newest addition to youth music education, has gotten off to a great start. With a class at Vickers Boys & Girls Club in North Park Hill starting just before the city-wide shut down, 10 children were actively attending weekly classes. Another BGC class is on the books for fall, possibly in the Montbello area. City Strings had 16 classes at 11 location in four counties this past year and we anticipate this same number of locations in the fall. However, we are expecting to have to cap classes at six which will result in 32 classes City Strings classes and four City Drums. This will also impact the program budget but that is being addressed as we move forward. Now, the two have been brought under the umbrella of "Music Encounters" which brings brand cohesion to the programs and positions Augustana Arts for future growth in this important service we provide to the community.

Thank you, as always, for your support of Augustana Arts. You are a valued partner and we are all grateful for your generosity. I will send you information on the fall performances as we solidify those plans.

If granted, how will the funds be utilized? The funds requested are to support our annual Theological Conference for our pastors, deacons, and lay ministry professionals. This year's gathering will be primarily via ZOOM and and small groups and will be focused on anti-racism. This is in-line with the Strategy Toward Authenic Diversity passed at the 2019 ELCA Churchwide Assembly (Attached). Specifically, we are requesting funds to pay musicans and artists of color for their contributions to our digital content. We are also making this year's conference free to all of our leaders of color/culture, so part of the funds requested will be used to cover their conference costs.

Dear Gifts Committee Members:

Thanks in part to generous past support from The Augustana Foundation, Work Options for Women (WOW) has been successful at helping very hard-to-employ individuals stabilize their lives and obtain permanent and sustainable employment.

As you know, WOW targets low-skilled but highly motivated students who must overcome major barriers before they can obtain employment. Our approach has been successful because we understand that job training in isolation will not lead to sustained and permanent employment for clients, such as ours, whose lives are frequently chaotic and complicated. Our combination of culinary skills training and individualized support services helps students to stabilize their lives, increase financial stability and self-sufficiency. This year WOW seeks \$5,000 to help fund the continued operation of our *Culinary Job Skills Training Program*.

WOW intentionally recruits and trains some of the Denver area's hardest-to-employ individuals — individuals who face multiple and substantial obstacles to employment. Nearly all of our students have a criminal record and many have a prior felony conviction. A high percentage are struggling to overcome the trauma associated with domestic violence. Most have a limited education, little or no work experience and were homeless or residing in an unstable living situation when they entered our training.

Sector-focused culinary skills training is a good fit for our students because food service is one of the few sectors open to hiring those with a criminal history, particularly a felony conviction. By helping our students to stabilize their lives and master the skills needed to obtain and retain *permanent* employment, we also indirectly help to increase stability and positive outcomes for the families of our students; an important first step in breaking the cycle of multi-generational poverty.

We hope that you agree that by helping some of Denver's most disadvantaged residents obtain long-term employment and increase their level of stability, our program furthers the Foundation's interests in increasing self-sufficiency. Work Options for Women

Hill Middle School

If granted, how will the funds be utilized? Funds will be used to support the Hill Cares committee that is part of the Hill PTSA. Currently, greater than 50% of families at Hill qualify for Free and Reduced Lunch benefits, and in years past the Hill Cares committee has been supporting them with holiday meals and gifts, bus passes, scholarships for extracurricular activities and tutoring snacks. This year, due to Covid-19 and the related economic impacts, we have been providing families with grocery cards to supplement other food aid. This program is new to Hill Cares and we would like to continue to serve these families. Funds will go both toward traditional programs (ie: holiday meals, etc.) and towards grocery cards.



Metro Caring

If granted, how will the funds be utilized? Over the course of the past 4 months Metro Caring has seen an increase in demand like no other time in our history. We are currently providing food to over 1,400 households per week, which is 3x the number of households we served in the same timeframe in 2019. Distribution is taking place in the parking lot of the building through drivethrough and walk-up collection as well as up to 100 home deliveries per week. Last week alone, we distributed a record 81,000 pounds of food to Denverites. With the need growing so quickly, unprecedented interruptions in the established food system, and many companies facing financial strain, the need for funds to purchase things like bulk food and baby items is greater than ever before.

If granted, funds from the Augustana Foundation will go toward purchasing culturally relevant foods like beans, rice, and maseca flour from local producers and distributors. Access to meat is also even lower than usual, so we will likely purchase meat items if they are available. We have recently begun a relationship with local diaper distributor, which donates products when they can and in return we also make purchases at a discounted rate. Since more than half of our participating families have children, diapers and other baby-related items are of great need for our community.

Funds help us to purchase locally produced food and maintain our highest standards of hygiene. Success for us in this period will look like a more just food system that incorporates choice, cultural relevancy, and safety in distribution.

Dear members of the Foundation Board,

In behalf of the Augustana Live Streaming Task Force I express our sincere appreciation for your generous grant, approved at your last meeting.

Having been a member of the Foundation Board some years ago I know that the sensitive issue is always the balance of money for community requests and those that fund projects at the church.

The equipment to stream events at Augustana, particularly our Sunday worship service, seems to address both foci. We are consistent with out vision to "Worship," "Grow," and "Go" as we invite the community (and, in fact the world) to worship with us, and we will have available the finest equipment for recording and streaming Augustana Arts and other contracted events.

I cannot recall any project that has generated such positive response. Streaming Augustana just seems to be the "right thing to do" for so many – and we've heard from them. Who would deny the fact that the timing is right?


So, in your important work of stewarding the funds of the Foundation, you have significantly advanced our project and allowed us to imagine more good things for Augustana.
