First of Anniversary Celebrations Goes Virtual

The Foundation was not about to let pandemic restrictions on public gatherings interfere with the first of its 50th Anniversary celebrations. Many Augustana community members attended a joyous virtual event livestreamed from the sanctuary on May 20.

The event was co-hosted by two former Foundation Presidents, **Todd Engdahl** and **Kevin Flesch**. In a lively conversational style, they shared interesting historical facts, personal experiences as Board members, and assessments of the Foundation's remarkable growth and its contribution to Augustana and the community through grants funded.

They noted that since its beginning, the Foundation has been the beneficiary of gifts totaling \$3 million (\$2.5 million from 34 estates; \$500,000 from innumerable annual gifts and memorials). These funds have been prudently invested, and returns on those investments have been used to fund grants of nearly \$2.9 million

In the summertime, I often go out on the narthex porch to eat lunch. Throughout the year, we get odd things left on the bench there: a Christmas wreath, clothing, blankets, and food items that we can't always use. On a day in June, there were these two candles

that were left burning next to the sanctuary door.

You may have seen candles like these in the store, decorated with various saints. Their purpose is to help a person's prayers be directed or perhaps gathered toward a certain intention. You might recognize in the photo that one of the candles is the



Sacred Heart of Jesus; the other features Saint Jude, the patron saint of hopeless causes.

Don't you wonder what was happening for the person or persons who left these candles? I wonder if they felt they were facing a dire situation of some kind which required powerful intercession. While Lutherans aren't much on lighting candles like these, we've all likely been in places in our lives that have us dropping to our knees in fervent prayer. Perhaps our journey through the pandemic was one of those times for you; or perhaps another time in your life when you were weighed down with hurt or grief; or maybe when you were in the midst of a difficult decision.

There is no "magic" to prayer, simply the promise that God will always hear us. There are no perfect words for our prayer either—simply a conversation that we are always invited to have with the One who loves us. I pray that whoever lit these candles felt God's presence in their conversation, and I pray that we do, too.

Grace, science, reopening, and reconnecting



Friends, family, and church members often wonder with me about what they "should be doing" or how they think they should be "handling it." Heck, I wonder about these things for myself, too. It doesn't even

matter what "it" is. It could be intense personal grief. Or a changing job situation. Or financial difficulty. Or emerging from pandemic ready for normal and not finding the normal that's expected. Quite often, I find myself saying things like "give yourself some grace" or "be gentle with yourself." I know from personal experience that this is easier said than done. But when I hear people say it to me, I find it easier to remember that I'm only human. And when I say it to other people, I'm reminded that they are too.

Gathering and reconnecting with each other in person has been spiritually and emotionally powerful for me and so many who have longed for these moments. Let's continue to give each other grace as the Reopening Taskforce evaluates CDC, local, state, ELCA, and Rocky Mountain Synod guidelines as well as other Metro Denver congregations' reopening plans for worship. Augustana is 1,100 adults and children strong plus countless new and long-time visitors. Not only do we have the science to consider—especially for our kids under 12 who cannot yet be vaccinated—we cover the spectrum from not being ready to come out of our homes, to being beyond ready to put any evidence of the pandemic behind us, to everything in between.

Grace by faith and trust in God's unconditional love is the foundation of all that we do together. I hope and pray that the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, keeps your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

Reopening Task Force updates worship guidelines

GOOD NEWS! As we all continue to work together to stop the spread of COVID-19, we have exciting updates to our Augustana reopening progression. Remember, our goal is to ensure a safe worship environment for all who attend, including unvaccinated children and attendees who are at high risk of infection.

- 1. Masks at 8 a.m. outdoor worship are now optional for FULLY vaccinated individuals, who can decide whether or not to wear a mask. We will follow the honor system.
- 2. We will still be asking everyone to wear a mask at the 10:30 a.m. worship, because beginning Sunday, June 20, the assembly resumed singing! As we have noted before, indoor singing is a higher-risk activity due to the expelling of respiratory droplets that can hang in the air for hours, so singing with masks will initially be required.

"Make a joyful noise to our Lord!"

- Registrations will continue, but the deadline for registrations has been extended to 7 a.m. Sunday morning. Registration continues for capacity monitoring and good record keeping in the event of contact tracing.
- 4. Social distancing with seating will continue with self-seating upon arrival and self-dismissal.

We rely on our congregation to make good decisions that are in line with the Center for Disease Control, local, state, and Rocky Mountain Synod guidelines, upon which these recommendations have been based.

These recommendations by your Reopening Task Force have been approved by your congregation council. Stay tuned for further progress with movement forward as we go through the summer months. Feel free to contact the pastors or anyone on the task force with your questions or comments.

Friday, May 28



(\$1.4 million for Augustana initiatives; \$1.5 million to 160 organizations in the region and around the world).

Senior Pastor **Ann Hultquist** spoke movingly in describing the Foundation as a vital component in Augustana's mission of Worship, Grow and Go. Citing examples of its significant contributions to all three areas, she told compelling stories of challenges, creativity, restoration, sustainability, and impact.

President **Kari Blanchard** acknowledged the organization's 50th birthday as an important milestone to celebrate. She succinctly summarized the central purposes of the Foundation as receiving gifts, investing them wisely, and distributing the earnings to worthy internal and external projects using a rigorous grantmaking process.

Before leaving the podium, she noted the 50 for 50 Campaign was the first of four anniversary events scheduled. She invited everyone to participate in the remaining three activities: a Lunch & Learn Series in June, a 3-Minute Video Grant Competition during late summer, and a wonderful Gala event on November 5. She thanked former President Marilyn Stember as the architect and overall project coordinator of the four events.

Excitement built during the evening as the success of the 50 for 50 Campaign was about to be revealed. Marilyn was joined by Bill Crossen, Chair of the Finance/ Investment Committee, to bring out the oversized check. A generous \$29,400 had been received to date. Final accounting of gifts received through May 31 increased that total to **\$32,350**.

The evening concluded with AVE and Friends performing an inspirational hymn under the direction of Daniel Romero. The alleluias in their selection reverberated praises to God for this vibrant ministry.

More than 50 gifts were received during the 50-day active campaign phase. Individual gifts ranged from \$50 to \$5,500, with most gifts at the \$50 and \$100 level.

Thank you to each and every donor who responded this year and those who have contributed in the past. Your gifts are enduring and will continue to make a difference for many generations to come. Special thanks to members of the Board of Directors whose \$10,000 matching gift got this campaign off to a great start.

Announcing 3-Minute Video Grant Competition beginning in July

The 50th Anniversary celebration of the Augustana Foundation continues with the **3-Minute Grant Competition**. The Foundation is pleased to announce it will be funding several special 50th



Anniversary Grant Awards in amounts ranging from \$1,500 to \$3,000.

Grant submissions will be made via a 3-minute video which can be uploaded at the Augustana Foundation website starting July 1. Videos will be accepted through September 15. 50-Year History Comes Alive

Retrieving, organizing, and reporting on a half-century of the Foundation's historical evolution is a daunting task, but how else does one understand how this organization grew with purpose over these 50 years?

Though challenged by a paucity of records from its first decades, a compilation of data for the 50-Year History is nearing completion. Board members leading this effort are **Bill Crossen** and **Howard Jacobsen**.

With Bill's dedicated effort and the able assistance of Lisa Mikolajczak, financial data over the 50-year

life of the Foundation has been retrieved from paper and electronic media. Among the largest databases completed include 1) gifts received by year from current and legacy donors, 2) growth in the fund principal by year since inception, and 3) grants awarded from interest income by year.

Bill also compiled annual Board of Directors membership lists from minutes and other archived documents. Remarkably, Board members have been identified for 48 of the 50 years. Missing are Board memberships for 1992 and 1997. If anyone has information on these years, please let us know so that all past leaders are honored this year.

Howard has been recording the chronology of important events by looking in the archives for historical facts, photos, or other documents. He promises some interesting stories in the months to come.

- All gifts to the Foundation contribute to the fund principal (corpus).
- Bequests have come from 34 estates and ranged from \$1,000 to \$900,000.
- Foundation also recipient of an annual annuity restricted for use in grant awards (~\$30,000/year).
- Gifts made during the lifetime of donors are comprised of:
 - honorariums to recognize people and special events,
 - memorials remembering people who have died, and
 - annual gifts and special gifts supporting the Foundation purpose.
- The Foundation must retain its corpus; at 12/31/2020, we had a cushion of about \$200,000.



• Gifts are invested pursuant to a well documented and thoroughly vetted investment policy.

- A diversified portfolio helps maximize returns while mitigating risk.
- Since 1986, the earliest date for which we have complete financial records, the Foundation has earned \$3 million on its investments and annuities.

Investment Income funds grants



- Since 1986, the Foundation has awarded \$2.6 million in grants.
- Support for Augustana ministries includes mission trips, music programs and numerous other areas.
- Augustana members attending Lutheran colleges and seminaries have benefited from scholarship awards.
- Grants have been given to 159 outside agencies during this 34-year period.






