It was work.

My daughter and son-in-law moved to a new duty station in

Oklahoma and bought their first house. The old carpeting throughout the ranch style home needed to go, so my husband and I spent several days with them in July, ripping up carpeting, pulling up tack strips from the concrete floor, and also removing tile. All of it had to go somewhere, so we had a constant procession carrying stuff out to the dumpster on the driveway in 95 degree heat and 90% humidity. Carpet knives, crowbars and hammers were required. At one point my son-in-law said "I can't believe people do this for a living!" It was work.

Many of you have had DIY experiences like this in your life, or maybe you are or were someone who did hard physical labor for a living. It's both exhausting and satisfying, isn't it?

I want to suggest that coming back to a more "normal" life as a congregation is work—hard work. I don't think that most of us thought that it would be. We envisioned people streaming back to worship and jumping back into life together with both feet. Honestly, the stream has been more of a trickle, and the feet are hesitant. It's work to re-engage, to change pandemic habits, and to figure out what the future looks like for our ministry. Many things have changed, including staff, and change is difficult for almost everyone.

And yet, this time also brings the gift of opportunity: to pray about what God is doing and will do through our congregation, to have freedom to envision ministry and programs in new ways, to welcome new folks into this Body of Christ, and to rebuild our community around our mission statement. *Celebrating God's grace, we welcome everyone to worship Jesus, grow in faith, and go serve in the world.*

It is work. Work that I hope you will engage in, as we trust in Christ and the power of the Holy Spirit who are also at work in each of us and in our congregation.

For some folks, God's voice is in the music; for others it's the actions we take on behalf of our neighbors; for others, it's the preaching; for others, it's that communion is open to everyone; and for others, it's the people who greet them warmly in worship—or, it's a combination of all of the above!

Augustana friends, we have the good news of Jesus to share with people who are struggling in confusing times. Inviting them to church may be the next right step in your journey and theirs.

Livestreaming worship and in-person worship update

People often ask how many people are worshiping on a Sunday. Livestream and in-person worship opportunities mean that is a question more easily answered in a table like the one below. It's a bit of an apples and oranges comparison, because in livestream numbers, we know only that there's a household worshiping, not the actual number of people worshiping in that household. In-person worship is a definitive number, counting errors notwithstanding. If you add the Combined Total Livestream number to the Sunday In-Person Total number, you would arrive at the minimum number of people who have worshiped.

In connection with "God's work. Our hands." Sunday on September 12, Augustana invites you to donate funds to purchase computers for the new ChristAid Secondary School in Kicuna, Uganda!

Imagine an unemployment rate approaching 70%. That is the case for young people (ages 18–30) in Uganda. While a quality education does not ensure employment, the opportunities for meaningful employment are much higher with an education. (The unemployment rate for



educated youths is approximately 30%). Unfortunately, unemployment leads to criminal activity, drug and alcohol addiction, and desperation among Uganda's youth. Certainly, we cannot fix the problem, but we can help.

Augustana and ChristAid International are partnering to provide a quality Christian education to the young people in southwest Uganda. The newly constructed ChristAid Secondary School is scheduled to open in 2022. The building is ready with desks and chairs in the classrooms, as well as bunks for the boarding students. Textbooks will soon be purchased, but one thing is desperately needed—access to technology and, specifically, computers.

A computer lab housing 30 computers for teachers and students will make it possible to teach the secondary school students (our middle school and high school students) the skills necessary to be successful in today's world. The computer desks are ready, as seen in the photo below with the school's headmaster. The electric power, which is brand new to the area, is connected. Even Internet is available.



As part of "God's work. Our hands." Sunday on September 12, Augustana will be raising funds to help ChristAid purchase new reliable computers for the secondary school. Watch for an announcement and more information about ChristAid in the August ePistles and September Tower with details on how to contribute to this effort. The cost of a computer is approximately \$500. In doing so, you will make a difference in the lives of the young people in Uganda.

Augustana Foundation 3-Minute Grant Competition

The 3-Minute Grant Competition is designed to engage the Augustana community in identifying worthy projects that could be implemented with the support of a small grant from the Foundation. This 50th Anniversary grant program especially encourages new initiatives or new congregational-outreach ministry collaborations that could be achieved with some financial support.

Members of the congregation, ministry groups, and staff are invited to submit applications. Similarly, community organizations who have a relationship or want to have a mission-based collaboration with Augustana are encouraged to apply. In collaborative projects, grant funds will go to the applicant organization.

The uniqueness of the 3-Minute Grant Competition is in the application. Instead of submitting a 10- or 15-page written application, the applicant submits a 3-minute video describing the project. Submitting a simple video application is expected to facilitate a creative and efficient process.

Grants awarded in this competition will be designated as 50th Anniversary Grant Awards. Funds for these awards have been reserved in FY2021 distribution dollars. Applicants in this competition are not precluded from submitting another similar or different application in the regular quarterly application cycle.

- Purpose must fit into one of these Foundation funding categories
 1) Enhances a congregational ministry
 - 2) Improves the physical facilities
 - 3) Contributes to a community outreach mission
- 3-minute videos can be shot using a cellular phone or video camera.
- Videos should showcase the organization or group, the specific need for the grant, and how the project or organization currently or potentially will be related to Augustana and its mission.
- In the video it is suggested that you address what you or your organization plan to do when grant funds are received—who, what, when, where, and how.
- Applicants can request up to \$3,000 for the proposed project.
- Applicants (e.g., individual, ministry group, community organization) can submit multiple applications for different projects.
- Video applications for the 50th Anniversary Grants Program must be submitted using the Augustana online application portal (<u>https://www.augustanadenver.org/augustana-foundation/3-minute-video-grant-competition/</u>).
- Deadline for applications is September 15.
- All submitted video applications that meet the competition criteria will be digitally combined for presentation to the Foundation's Board of Directors.
- The Foundation's Gifts/Grants Committee will systematically review the 3-minute applications using its established process. Final decisions will be made by the Foundation Board.
- The Augustana community will have an opportunity to view videos from the finalists.
- Grants awarded through this competition will be presented to recipients at the Gala on November 5. Applicants are encouraged to attend.
- Applicants in this special 50th Anniversary competition may apply for a similar or different project in the regular quarterly grant review cycle. However, if applications for both methods are selected, award funding may be adjusted to avoid duplication.

Leadership Matters—Then and Now

Board members who have served during the Foundation's history were identified as part of the 50th Anniversary Project. About 100 members of the congregation appeared on that list—some names that are well known today and some that were not so familiar. Just who were the earlier saints that individually and collectively contributed their foresight, expertise, and experience to guide the development and growth of the Foundation? Meeting minutes and financial reports provided only a glimpse.

Leadership mattered then, and it matters now. How did these leaders define the parameters and priorities of the organization? How did they face challenges and identify opportunities? How did the elected presidents lead with Christian values, commitment, clarity, and courage to make their boards as effective as they could be? During this milestone year, we pause with gratitude to recognize and honor the Foundation's past and present leaders.

When the Foundation Fund was created a halfcentury ago, the designated leadership was known as

the Memorial Gifts Fund Committee, a name that followed logically from the memorial gifts account that seeded the Foundation. As specified in the originating resolution, the responsibility of the Committee was "to promote the fund, invest or arrange for the investment of moneys of the fund, and recommend projects and undertakings for which distributions from the fund may be used" (Resolution

#9, 1971). The name of this group was eventually changed to the Board of Directors.

From the Foundation's inception, a nine-member board has been appointed by the Congregation Council for three-year terms. Terms were wisely structured in a way that retires one-third of the board each year. Members can be reappointed for one additional term.

The pastor was designated an ex-officio member from the onset, and the council president was added midpoint in its history as an ex-officio member. Both ex-officio members were formally added to the board with voting privileges when bylaws of the Augustana Foundation were adopted in 2018. Appointed to serve on the first board identified in the archives were: David Bernard, Palmer Burch, Lennart Erickson, Ralph Hansen, William Hulwick, Carl Johnson, Elmer Moe, Vernon Thorwald, and Cyrus Wells. Officers elected by these appointees were: President Lennart Erickson, Secretary David Bernard, and Treasurer Cyrus Wells. Pastor Marbury Anderson served in an ex-officio capacity.

The current Board of Directors is comprised of: Kari Blanchard (President), Tim Zeckser (Vice President), Tim Garrington (Secretary), Janet Egan (Treasurer), Bill Crossen, Russ Epperson, Howard Jacobsen, Julie Shellhorn, and Marilyn Stember. Senior Pastor Ann Hultquist and Congregation President Michael Zumwalt complete the board roster.

Elected presidents over time have had the special responsibility to be true to the mission and purpose of the organization, lead with vision, and be accountable to both church leaders and their board colleagues. The listing of presidents (1978–2021) acknowledges those 16 leaders who were elected and entrusted by their board colleagues to use their time, talents, and leadership skills to preserve and grow the Foundation's assets while making significant impact in the church and in its local and global community.

A half-century ago, wise Augustana members had the vision to create the Augustana Foundation which provides the church a mechanism to thrive into the future caring for its congregation and for its broader community. Leadership mattered then, and it matters now. During this jubilee year, gratitude is given for the many leaders who have promoted the fund, managed and invested assets, and distributed investment earnings that provide a steady stream of funding to advance the mission and ministries of Augustana Lutheran Church.
