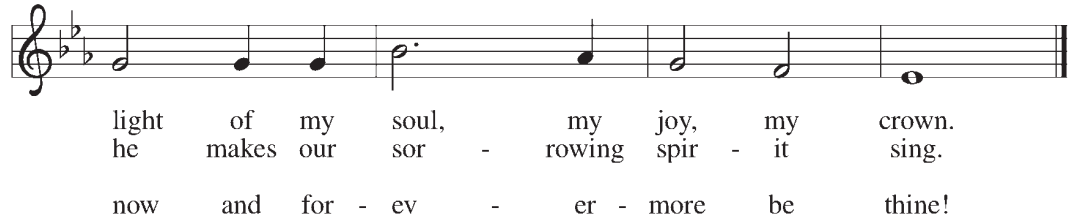

Lorna LaVerne Deines Schillereff was born on February 11, 1932, to Jacob and Emma Ochsner Deines in Ft. Collins, Colorado. She has a younger brother Alvin Jacob Deines, still living.

Lorna attended Fossil Creek Elementary School in Ft. Collins, Colorado. She graduated from North High School in Denver in 1950. Post high school, she took business classes at Emily Griffith Opportunity School. Later in life, she continued her education at Red Rocks Community College.

Lorna worked at Mountain Bell and sang with her father, Jacob Deines, in the Mountain Bell Singers. She was an active member at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Denver, CO, in both Luther League and Choir. She met the love of her life, Herbert George Schillereff, at St. Paul. They were married on August 25, 1957.

Lorna was actively involved in PTA and served as PTA President at Wilmore-Davis Elementary and as PTA President for Jefferson County. She was a room mother, teacher's aide, Girl School helper, and Precinct chairwoman. Lorna and Herb served as Worthy Matron and Worthy Patron at Peace Chapter, No 151, from 1970–1971. Lorna returned to full-time work as a Principal's Secretary at Wilmore-Davis Elementary School. She retired from Jefferson County Public Schools as an Accounting Technician in 1993. Post retirement, Lorna was an active volunteer at Lutheran Medical Center.

Lorna and Herb raised two children—Sharon Lynn born in 1960 and Steven Jacob in 1964. Prior to the birth of the children, Lorna rode on the back of Herb's Harley-Davidson at several El Jebel Shrine Motorcycle Patrol events. Summer vacations were a norm for the family traveling around the United States. Post retirement, Lorna and Herb continued traveling around the United States in a 34-foot motor home, attending baseball camps in Tucson, AZ, and visiting with friends and family.

Lorna and Herb loved attending sporting events—Rockies baseball games, Bronco football games,

Avalanche hockey games, Nuggets basketball and CSU football games. They also attended the symphony, musicals and plays. They were active members at Augustan Lutheran Church in Denver, Colorado, including singing in the Senior Elite Choir. Lorna also loved attending rock and roll concerts.

Lorna is survived by children—Sharon Schillereff, Steven Schillereff; grandchildren—Megan, Gabriel and Logan Schillereff; along with numerous nieces and nephews.

Herbert George Schillereff

January 24, 1928–May 17, 2021

Herbert (Herb) was born on January 24, 1928 in Casper, WY. He passed in his sleep on May 17, 2021, at the age of 93, at his home in Wheat Ridge, CO. He was predeceased by his wife, Lorna LaVerne Deines Schillereff, parents Mary Eisenach Schillereff and Jacob Schillereff, sisters Ruth Schillereff and Pauline Schillereff Dobler and brother Herman (Ike) Schillereff. Herb is survived by his children Sharon Schillereff and Steven Schillereff (children Megan, Gabriel and Logan) and his sister Florence Schillereff Stowe of Shrewsbury, MA.

The family moved from Casper, WY in 1932 to Fort Morgan, CO. Herb graduated from Fort Morgan High School in 1947 where he was All Conference in Football. He attended CSU for a brief period and worked a variety of jobs to support himself and pay for school. Due to financial constraints, Herb left CSU and in 1949, completed the Ironworker Apprenticeship program. He worked as an Ironworker until he joined the US Navy Seabees in 1950 and served in the Korean War. He was discharged in 1954. Herb returned to Colorado where he lived in Fort Morgan for a short period before moving to Denver to continue working with the Ironworkers Local Union #24. Herb worked as the Steward for the Ironworkers on a variety of projects. He transitioned from working in the field to being the Coordinator for the Ironworker Apprenticeship program.

After returning to Denver, Herb began attending St Paul Lutheran Church where he met the love of his life, Lorna LaVerne Deines. They were married at St Paul Lutheran Church on August 25, 1957.

Herb finally completed his BS in Education from CSU in 1975. He earned his Masters in Education in 1978 and completed his D Certificate.

In 1980, Herb accepted an offer from Emily Griffith Opportunity School to oversee the Apprenticeship programs which included not only the building trades but the beauticians, chefs and barbers. Herb served as an Assistant Principal at Emily Griffith until he retired in 1993. He also retired from the Ironworkers at the same time. Post retirement, Herb was active on the Emily Griffith Foundation until 2006.

Herb was a 32nd° Mason, a member of El Jebel Shrine, and he and Lorna were both active in Eastern Star Peace Chapter No. 151. In the El Jebel Shrine, Herb was active in the Motorcycle Patrol back in the day, the Meeters, and Jeffco Shrine Club. Both Herb and Lorna loved sharing stories of their adventures in the Motorcycle Patrol and riding over Loveland Pass in a snowstorm.

Post retirement, Herb and Lorna loved traveling around the United States in a 34-foot motor home, attending Spring Training in Arizona and visiting with friends and families. They enjoyed attending a variety of sporting events, especially CSU football games, and enjoyed attending the symphony, musicals and plays. They were active members at Augustana Lutheran Church in Denver, CO.
