Let us confess our sins to the one who welcomes us with an open heart.


Silence is kept for reflection. The people may kneel.





The refrain will be sung first by the cantor, then by the assembly, and again by the assembly after the verses as indicated.







We praise you loving God, today, tomorrow, and forever. Amen.


Lord's Prayer
