Welcome to worship this Reformation Sunday! October 31 is Reformation Day each year. Today we remember Martin Luther's 16th century church reforms: theology of grace, worship practice, scripture in the common language, and much more. As in Luther's age, so in ours: God's word is alive, surprises with grace, and sets us free by faith. Ancient writers speak to us through scripture today and enliven our faith: Paul declares justification by faith apart from works and Christ sets us free for the sake of the world.

Also today, during 10:30 a.m. worship, we celebrate with the Confirmation youth whose three years of study culminates in the Affirmation of Baptism. These young people pick up as their own the promises that their parents made to them at baptism. Confirmation is a milestone through which they continue asking questions of faith and doubt as baptized people.

Because of CDC guidelines, masks are highly recommended for everyone at worship for both vaccinated and unvaccinated people. Unvaccinated people should continue to wear masks.

Please make room in the pew for people who arrive after you by sitting in the middle of the pew. This opens up the aisle seating for others so that everyone has a place to worship.

Sign the worship slip and place it in the offering plate so that hospitality, prayer, and pastoral care may be kept up to date.

A reading from Jeremiah.





Second Reading • Romans 3:19–28

A reading from Romans.

¹⁹Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰For "no human being will be justified in his sight" by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.

²¹But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; ²⁴they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he

had passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus.

²⁷Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.







Do this for the remembrance of me.


Lord's Prayer
