Welcome to worship on this Christmas Eve! We are thankful that you are here at Augustana, and so thankful that we are able to gather together in person for worship.

This day is a powerful reminder to us that in the long days and nights of the past two years, we have been embraced by Emmanuel "God With Us." Today we sing that good news together, we hear it announced by angels, and we taste it in Holy Communion. 


