

# Leigh Quist

July 31, 1926–August 4, 2021

Leigh Quist was born on July 31, 1926, in the small farming community of Boyd, MN—one of four boys. He was baptized and confirmed at Trinity Lutheran Church and spent his summers working as a farmhand. He graduated from Boyd High School in 1944 where he was



valedictorian. In August of that year, he joined the Navy as a naval radio operator and served in the Pacific Theater during the Second World War.

After his honorable discharge in 1946, Leigh attended St. Olaf College and graduated with a degree in Economics in 1950. He married Joyce Anderson in 1947, and they moved to Montevideo, MN, where he sold life insurance. Together they had three children—Jerry, Janice, and John.

Leigh moved to Colorado in 1963, where he remained for the rest of his life—first living in Boulder and then Denver. In Denver, he joined Augustana Lutheran Church, where he became an integral part of the church community. He twice



served as the president of the congregation, and served as treasurer for eight years. He also served tirelessly behind the scenes counting money, running the dishwasher, baking bread, helping with the monthly newsletter, and folding the service bulletins, among many other jobs. On many occasions, Leigh was asked to give lectures on Martin Luther and Frederick the Wise. In the mid-1990s, Augustana's Quist Park was named in his honor.



He married Jean Van Housen in 1981. Together they enjoyed downhill skiing and all that Vail had to offer. After her death, he married Babs Persons in 2000. Leigh and Babs enjoyed traveling, reading, gardening, and feeding the birds (and squirrels).

He died in his sleep shortly after his 95th birthday, on August 4, 2021.

Leigh is survived by two of his children—Janice and John—as well as two grandchildren, Mark Ehlers and Jenn Smith, her husband, James Smith; three great-granddaughters, Anna, Kennedy and Kensington; and an older brother, Warren.
