



Please turn toward the back of the sanctuary as the processional cross enters, and turn toward the front of the sanctuary as the cross passes you.








First Reading • Acts 7:55-60


A reading from Acts.







"My Hope is Built" –Tom Treeney Chancel Choir



Lord's Prayer


