The Stabat Mater is a 13th-century Christian hymn to Mary which portrays her suffering as Jesus Christ's mother during his crucifixion.

Pastor Frank Philipp, Augustana member and retired pastor, is leading worship today in Pastor Caitlin Trussell's absence. We're grateful for his leadership on this holy day.

Christ above in torment hangs; she beneath beholds the pangs of her dying glorious Son.

- 5. Bruised, derided, cursed, defiled, she beheld her tender child all with bloody scourges rent.
- 6. For the sins of His own nation, saw Him hang in desolation, till His spirit forth He sent.
- O thou Mother, fount of love! Touch my spirit from above; make my heart with thine accord.
