Tamra Ruth Mohs was born on March 17, 1960 to David and Ruth Hofstad. She loved her siblings: Lynn, Alan, Jon, Troy, "Little" Tam, Toni, and Tina. In her free time, she loved visiting the family farms and her beloved grandparents, who taught her to ride a horse and would always fill her with her favorite foods and sweets. In high school, she was a cheerleader for both football and hockey, and she always liked to brag that she could do the splits on skates. In addition to her athletics, she played both piano and saxophone, and she won the John Phillips Sousa award her senior year. As if these activities were not enough, Tammy got a job as a carhop at A&W, though she got the job mostly so she could have free root beer whenever she wanted.

During her 38 years of marriage to Timothy Mohs, Tammy worked her way from an Associates Degree in Nursing through to a Doctorate of Nursing Practice. Through her career, she worked as an ICU Registered Nurse, an administrator and trainer for new medical software, a Nurse Practitioner in hospice, an Adjunct Professor at Saint Ambrose University, and a traveling ER Nurse Practitioner. She had an enormous heart and was known for her patience and kindness.

If you asked Tammy, she would say that her greatest pride and joy were her four children: Kari, Chris, Laura, and Megan. Throughout their childhood, Tammy and Tim took their children on as many trips as they could. They were able to visit many U.S. states and several international locations as a family. She moved to Colorado to be a Nurse Practitioner in an Emergency Room so that she could be closer to her children. Near the end of her life, Tammy took great pleasure in spending time with her five grandchildren: Jack, Ginny, Aiden, Jeffrey, and Stella. One of her greatest wishes was to meet her two grandsons, Wylder and Logan,

due in November and January. She spent a great deal of her time taking the grandkids places and FaceTiming with the ones who were further away.

Tammy loved to travel. Outside of family trips, she took time to travel on her own. She attended and spoke at a conference in Canada, presented her research and findings at a conference in Finland, and was preparing research for a conference in Hawaii when Covid hit. She also took time to travel to Norway and France, where she fulfilled a lifelong dream of taking a class in French cooking. Everywhere she went, she reveled in the opportunity to expand her palette and try all of the local cuisine. When at home, she spent her time gardening, knitting, and quilting. In between, she would watch HGTV and drive her son-in-laws crazy by being frustratingly right about the need for renovations in their houses. Starting in November, you could always find Tammy in the basement curled up in a cozy blanket and watching Hallmark movie marathons.

While it may seem from the above comments that Tammy had a full schedule, she still managed to squeeze in even more. She volunteered for various church committees, attended church mission trips, helped out in the church garden, joined booster clubs and PTAs at her childrens' schools, and tried to squeeze in every event of her children that she could manage. She knew how to fill in every second of every day.

Tammy passed away September 9, 2023 at Denver Hospice in Denver, Colorado. She was surrounded by her children and had spent the week surrounded by her parents and siblings as well. Without a doubt, she is now riding her horse through the streets of heaven and working on ways to make the whole operation more efficient.



We are amazed and overwhelmed by the outpouring of support we have received during this time. Mom touched many, many lives in her too short time, which is apparent by the number of messages we have received. We are eternally grateful to everyone who loved our mother, and she loved all of you.
