





Undie Sunday Blessing and Children’s Sermon

Our Compassion and Action with our Neighbors (CAN)

Ministry invited us to accompany people of all ages with their unseen needs in a visible way. We’ve called this Undie Sunday at Augustana for the last five years. Over the last four weeks, you’ve grown the pile of Personal Care Kits for Lutheran World Relief, feminine products for Ruby’s Market and George Washington High School, underwear and socks for our local school—McMeen Elementary, and diapers and wipes for Foster

Source. Today we ask God's blessing on these items, the people who will use them, and the organizations who directly serve the people.
