





Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

(Matthew 28:18-20)

Almighty God, who has given you the will to do these things, graciously give you the strength and compassion to perform them. **Amen.**






## Offertory Prayer

## Holy Communion


The assembly is seated.

If you are worshiping with us on livestream, you may use bread or crackers and wine or juice from your home. We invite you to share this bread of life and cup of blessing as we all are one in Christ. We will receive Communion together after the singing of the hymn.




