



### Gospel • Mark 9:30-37


The holy gospel according to Mark. Glory to you, O Lord.

He did not want anyone to know it; <sup>31</sup>for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of Man is to be betrayed into human hands, and they will kill him, and three days after being killed, he will rise again." <sup>32</sup>But they did not understand what he was saying and were afraid to ask him.



You are invited to greet one another with these words: "Peace be with you."






### Great Thanksgiving


#### Invitation to Communion

- If you are unable to come forward for communion, please inform an usher so that communion may be brought to you in the pew.




## SENDING \*
