Welcome to worship on Christ the King Sunday! On this last Sunday in the church year, we learn that our story is not so different from the ancient people of faith in the Bible. As in their day, so in ours. We long for a leader who agrees with our priorities and battles to make them happen. Yet Jesus claims a different kingship—one of sacrificial love so deep that it refuses to lift a hand in violence against the people who betray, deny, desert, and destroy him. The church's New Year's Eve celebrates Jesus' kingship that meets us in our darkest least-lovable places, loves us anyway, and offers new life over the power of darkness.

10:30 a.m. worship is livestreamed weekly especially to include our home-centered members who cannot join us in person. Celebrating our public worship, we also protect our kids in real time on livestream by redirecting the cameras to other views during children's time and communion.





The candidate is baptized.




Holy Communion




