Is Any Body There? Yes!

Jan and I were meeting in my office when Lyn Goodrum came to the door. A labor and delivery nurse had just called the church. Parents of a newborn who did not survive pregnancy asked for a pastor to come bless her. I anointed her with special oil, trusting that God's heart cradled



her and her devastated parents. It was one of the most heartbreaking privileges of my nursing and pastoral careers.

On a less dramatic but emotionally relevant note, I led the Discover Augustana class of folks drawn to learn more about the congregation after worshiping for a few weeks or many months. Their stories resonate with my own of finding a church, a place to experience God's grace and be reminded of God's promises through the cross of Jesus. The conversations they've had in the pews with some of you warm my heart.

Being together is healing even if we can't quite describe its effects. Come and connect with others during the Celebration Coffee on March 2 before Lent begins on March 5 with Ash Wednesday. The joy is all the sweeter for the contrast of suffering in our lives. That is not a reason for suffering. Please hear that clearly. But the reality of suffering, of our mortality, is that we are cradled in God's heart by the power of prodigal grace. Welcome to Lent.

We gather "in the flesh"

It was five years ago that Covid-19 was beginning to cause fear and anxiety. The first days of March 2020, marked when coronavirus cases in the U.S. reached 100.

Within several weeks, our lives totally changed. No gatherings. No hugs. No celebrations. No sporting events. No music. No worship. Just disembodied, two-dimensional faces on a Zoom screen. It was miserable.

But then I remember when Church opened up again. The social-distancing was odd and complicated, but I remember tears streaming down my face as we gathered *in the flesh* again, singing and praying and *being*—together.

We gathered in the flesh. As bodies. As people who experience living and loving through our senses, among those in community, in our experiences—together.

We say Jesus is God's love, embodied, in the flesh. During the season of Lent



we will be reflecting on what it is to be individually each a miraculous body, but together, the Body of Christ.

So "Is Any Body There?" "Yes!" indeed.

We come to you, O loving Lord, in our distress and pain, in trust that through our nights and days, your grace will heal, sustain. (Stz. 5, ELW 617)

Oh, but isn't it difficult to trust!? Pain and sorrow, doubt, fear and anger surround us. My seminary professor used to start and end every conversation about difficult situations with "Go to the cross."

What's waiting for us at the cross? **Jesus is always** at the cross, knowing our lives, suffering with us. As another of our healing hymns sings, "I came to Jesus as I was, so weary, worn, and sad; I found in him a resting place, and he has made me glad" (ELW 612). A resting place can provide a pause. A time or a sensation of stopping, in order to take a break, breathe, reconsider, renew. When we have a moment to rest or pause, we have the chance to see Jesus all around us: in our family and friends, coworkers, medical staff, pastors, teachers, recreation managers—all who share our human story of sorrow and joy. Who walk with us in the renewal, maybe even new life which we receive through Jesus.

We taste, see, touch, and know that new life every Sunday, through our trust in God's word, water, bread and wine. So, when you are disconsolate, come to the mercy seat, bring your wounded hearts, because earth has no sorrow that heav'n cannot heal (ELW 607).



"Come," God invites us. Come to the cross. Because **God is always at the cross,** raising us with Christ to wholeness. Not judging us according to our sins, but leaving our sins at the cross. God did not leave Jesus in the tomb, but raised him to new life, therefore, we can trust that we are raised with Christ to that same new, renewed, rest-filled life.

The world is longing to know, from us, what new life looks like.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday March 5!



Communion instruction offered for young people







Helen Thorpe got to know refugee students from all over the world in the newcomers class at Denver South High School 2015–2016. The family that Augustana's refugee team is helping, the Sumaidis, also came from the Democratic Republic of Congo by way of a refugee camp in Tanzania.

The oldest girl in the Sumaidi family, Tatu, currently attends Denver South High School and is in the newcomers class. We are so lucky that Helen Thorpe lives in Denver and is willing to come to Augustana to tell us what it was like to see the progress of the students in the newcomers class and what they had to teach her.

Caring for Someone with Dementia and Alzheimer's Disease

As the U.S. population ages, the number of people diagnosed with dementia each year is projected to double—from about 514,000 cases in 2020 to about 1 million a year by 2060. Many of you may know or be living with a person with dementia or Alzheimer's Disease.

From the Dementia Society of America website:

Dementia is not a specific disease. It is a descriptive term for a collection of symptoms that can be caused by a number of disorders that affect the brain. People with dementia have significantly impaired intellectual functioning that interferes with normal activities and relationships. Alzheimer's is the most common cause of dementia, accounting for an estimated 60% to 80% of cases.

Persons living with dementia can lose their ability to solve problems and maintain emotional control, and they may experience personality changes and behavioral problems, such as agitation, delusions, and hallucinations.

Some recommendations on interacting with persons living with Dementia (from the National Council of Certified Dementia Practitioners):

- Address the person by their preferred name or familiar name.
- Focus your attention on the person and make eye contact.
- Do not make abrupt changes in the person's routine.
- Validate their feelings and provide reassurance.
- Be guiding, not controlling. Be calm.
- Enter their reality. Depending on their stage of dementia, their agitation may increase when trying to reorient them.
- When providing care, provide one instruction at a time.



- Allow adequate time for the person to respond to questions—it can take 90 seconds for a person living with dementia to process and respond to a question.
- Be sure their basic needs are being met bathing, toileting, sleep, eating, drinking fluids, having their hearing aids in, do they have their glasses or dentures.
- If becoming more agitated, provide a calm environment, a calming voice, decrease background noise.
- Provide meaningful activities, if able, as this can make them feel useful.
- Provide them with familiar items, pictures, books, etc.
