



Safe Spaces

According to Merriam-Webster, the term safe space refers to places "intended to be free of bias, conflict, criticism, or potentially threatening actions, ideas, or conversations." It is a place where marginalized groups can discuss issues pertinent to them without having to address questions or remarks that might be directed at them from majority groups in society who are not familiar

with certain issues. The term originated in LGBTQ culture, but has since expanded to include any place where a marginalized minority (e.g., gender, racial, religious, ethnic) can come together to communicate regarding their shared experiences.

Welcome 150 Projects are Underway!

Thanks to your generosity, May was a busy month for the Welcome 150 teams!

Augustana's Property Committee began planning for the chiller upgrade and education wing HVAC renewal long before the funds were available. We thank them for their vision, enabling two complex projects to be initiated just six months after Phase 1 campaign funds were committed.

New Air Conditioning Chiller:

- ☐ The old chiller was removed, and the new chiller was placed with the help of a large crane.
- Work continues to install the needed pipes and electrical system to get the new system functional by early June.

• Education Wing HVAC Renewal:

Ceiling tiles in the second-floor classrooms of the education wing have been removed and disposed of so the fan coil HVAC units can be replaced and new ceiling tiles installed. This work is being accomplished

- by the same contractor replacing the chiller and is expected to be completed by September.
- Upgrading the air handling systems in the education wing now will allow the use of this space as other areas of the campus undergo renovation in the next months and years. This year, summer ministries like Day Camp with Sky Ranch Lutheran Camp and Missoula Children's Theatre that would normally use this space, will be relocated to other spaces.
- Eidos Architects has been engaged and is working closely with the Welcome 150 Design Advisory group to develop architectural drawings and other planning documents needed to guide the project forward. (More information on this process will be provided in the Welcome 150 quarterly update next month.)

An Easter Letter to Augustana Memorial Garden Families about Welcome 150

Pastor Caitlin co-wrote a letter with Ellen Kastens about our Memorial Garden and the Welcome 150 Capital Campaign. Here is Ellen's story. Read Pastor Caitlin's in the full letter at <u>augustanadenver.org/</u>Welcome-150.

Ellen's Story

Back when the Memorial Garden was a mere vision and Augustana was raising funds to make it a reality, I was in my early 20s, and a final resting place for family wasn't a thought. I didn't contribute toward the fund and hadn't

imagined the importance this sacred place would become to me just a few years after its completion. In 1991, and with three generations of my family worshiping at the church, my husband and I were the first ones in our family to place a loved one there—our precious infant son Tommy. A week later and unexpectedly,

my mother joined Tommy, and several years after, my father. I am grateful for this sacred ground that I have come to love for its solace, comfort

and beckoning nature. I often pop into the Memorial Garden at times of melancholy, joy, and those in between and share with my loved ones all that's happening in my life without uttering a word.

Augustana is the only church home I can remember. My family joined when I was two years old, and it soon became the backdrop for many of my life's moments. Today, worshiping in the same sanctuary pew where I sat with my family as a youngster and singing the familiar

hymns that I sang alongside my parents so many years ago connects me to them anew. Singing hymns each Sunday with the collective Augustana family, I am supported, awakened to my past, and filled with the presence of God, ready to face life's weekly challenges.

One recent Sunday, our nearly three-year-old granddaughter clutched my hand and pulled me

into the Memorial Garden. Alongside my husband and me, she mimicked our ritual of tapping our toe three times on Tommy's stone, then three times on my parents'. In a barely audible voice, Quincey chimed, "Tap, tap, tap, Grammy. Tap, tap, tap, Grumps." The music from the service moments before and this personal shared ritual with Quincey weave together our growing family's past, present,



and future and unite us with our larger Augustana family.

As a young adult, I may not have contributed to the Memorial Garden, but I am so grateful for those before me who did. Now much older, and hopefully wiser,

I support and pray for the Welcome 150 Campaign to keep Augustana thriving and to safeguard all that we cherish and hold dear.

Who was Rattlesnake Kate?

In 1925, "Rattlesnake" Kate Slaughterback killed 140+ snakes that attacked her and her 3-year-old son while they were out on horseback. She returned the next day, gathered the snakes, and turned their skins into a flapper dress, cementing her place as an icon of the Wild West. She was a trailblazer for females at the time who pushed the boundaries of what was expected of women at the time.

Augustana Homes Good Neighbor Policy

The Good Neighbor Policy was developed through conversations between Habitat for Humanity and Augustana to help clarify the relationship between Augustana Lutheran Church and Augustana Homes homebuyers. Our mutual goal is to treat them like any neighbor—with respect and welcome. The guidelines ensure that the homeowners in this community feel welcomed into the neighborhood while their privacy and preferences are respected.

The goals are to:

- Ensure that the homebuyers at Augustana Homes feel comfortable and respected throughout their homebuying process and after closing on their homes.
- Offer helpful guidelines about how to interact with homeowners respectfully and appropriately.
- Provide expectations for Habitat homeowners and Augustana congregation members about shared spaces (i.e. park, parking areas).

Construction on two Augustana Homes completed!

As summer arrives, the activity on the job site for Augustana Homes continues to grow.

The construction for the first two units of the project, located on the east side of the project, has basically been completed.

Once the new homeowner has been selected, exterior grading and landscaping will be completed with the rest of the homes.

The progress on the second building, units 3 and 4, is in the finish stage, completing all interior and exterior finish tasks in the next couple of months. HFH will be completing construction on these units soon, and selecting the new homeowners.

The third building, units 5 and 6, is now completely dried in, and has a completed roof and siding in place. Interior rough ins for the electrical,



plumbing and mechanical are under way, and should be completed soon.

The fourth building, located at the far west end of the project, is in the middle of framing now. The first floor framing has been completed, and the second floor and roof will be in place soon! If you have not had a chance, please take a look at the project as it is really taking shape, and will be a wonderful neighborhood that Augustana can take pride in for years to come.

Human Dignity Delegates host Listening Groups



On May 8, Human Dignity Delegates and Together Colorado hosted listening groups here at Augustana. Thirty people, including Augustana members and individuals from other faith communities, accepted the invitation to identify their state and local issues and concerns. Concerns ran the gamut from food shortages, inconsistencies of educational opportunities across our community, to clean air and water. Together Colorado's goal is to produce a moral agenda/platform that can be used to persuade our lawmakers to make decisions based on human dignity and justice.
